Where Have All The People Gone?

Church pews are no longer as full as they were years ago. Young families with children are fewer in number. Middle and high school youth are often too busy to attend youth events or even confirmation classes. Young adults are all but completely absent. Many in our circle of friends no longer attend church anywhere.

We are living amidst a great sea-change in American culture. Over the past 50 years most churches have suffered steady decline. During the last decade the decline grew steeper and it has grown steeper still in our present decade. The fastest growing religious group in America are the "Nones," those who are unaffiliated with any religious institution. Their number is approaching nearly one third of the population. But it's not just about the numbers: church has lost both pride of place in people's lives and significant influence in the the wider culture.

How did we get here? How did the church lose traction in the most religious country among the Western nations? What are the disconnects with people? How do we meaningfully respond?

These are important questions for churches to ask going forward, especially churches like ours that are preparing to call a new pastor.

During the first four Sundays in October we will explore these questions together. We are even commandeering the Coffee Hour for this important discussion in hopes of maximizing participation. Our conversation will be given structure by the series, Where Have All the People Gone?, by Lutheran theologian and pastor David Lose. With humor and an engaging style, Lose provides penetrating insights into reasons why we are no longer connecting with people and he suggests fruitful ways forward worthy of our consideration.

Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes September 12, 2023

Council president Leslie Anderson called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Those attending were Pastor Mike Ostrom, Melanie Hein, Peter Swant, Eric Schmid, Carmen Funderburk, Sara Pinkerton, Barbara Hoffman, John Lohrmann, Cecilia Rutledge, Marit Rasmussen, Karleen Heintzberger.

Devotions were given by John Lohrmann.

August 8, 2023 minutes were revised and approved by email August 20, 2023.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Cecilia Rutledge submitted a written financial report for the month of August: Operational income came in \$3,776 more than budgeted for the month. Operational expenses were \$4,605 less than budgeted for the month. Total operational funds resulted in a net inflow of \$6,314 for August. Designated/Restricted account activity resulted in a net outflow of \$479 for the month. Overall combined funds resulted in a net inflow of \$5,835 for August.

Committee Reports:

Property: Dan recommended that resurfacing, sealing, striping the parking lot be included in the 2024 budget discussion, at the cost of \$14,032.

Finance & Budget: Council needs to start thinking of the 2024 Budget items for your committees. Feel free to send any expense related items to Eric.

Worship: We have resumed using glass communion cups on a weekly basis. This practice makes sense from a sustainability perspective as well as an economic one. We will no longer buy and then dispose of 80-100 plastic cups per week. Please know that the glass cups are carefully washed in hot soapy water each Sunday. In addition, altar care volunteers are looking into options for running the glass cups through the church's dishwasher. If any altar care volunteers would prefer to not wash cups, please contact Barbara Hoffman--she and Kurt will be happy to wash cups for you.

Evangelism: Karleen and Linda Lohrmann are wrapping up work on the membership list for the MSP. We are having many visitors worshiping with us. Pastor Mike and Karleen are working on a New Member Sunday this fall.

Personnel: Jeff Wagner has assumed the Sexton position.

Youth Education: Leslie, Sara, Emily, Charleen Kaaen, and Kirsten Brannon met to address concerns regarding middle and high school education and activities. The meeting outcome defines what Youth Education encompasses at CLC. Is there interest in Godly Play presentations for Advent and Lent?

Youth and Family: Nothing new to report

Fellowship: The ice cream social was a success.

Outreach: Nothing new to report.

Adult Education: Pastor Mike has located a copy of the video series, "Where Have All the People Gone?" by David Lose. This class will begin on October 1st at 10:45. The booklets "On the Freedom of a Christian" by Martin Luther have arrived. This Sunday study will follow later this fall.

Stewardship: Nothing new to report.

Pastor's Report: Pastoral care acts included Maxine Amen's funeral, Juanita Merrifield's celebration of life gathering, and a home visit to a shut-in at the VA. Pastor led a workshop to create a mindset around the work ahead for the MSP team. Mike is impressed with the Godly Play program that is in place for our children. Confirmation class will begin November 5th after worship.

New Business:

- A. Congregational, internal:
 - 1. Organists' compensation. A motion passed to pay all organists that play at CLC \$150. per performance or Sunday worship
 - 2. Portico retirement adjustment. A motion passed to cover the additional \$50. monthly charge for Pastor Mike's retirement account.
 - 3. A motion passed that funds gathered on Quilt Sunday be used for freight costs and supplies as needed by the Mission Group.
 - 4. A motion passed to use the ELCA Good Gifts program during Advent. Distribution of Advent offerings will be discussed at a later date.
 - 5. Call process update. Leslie explained a team is in place and has begun work on the MSP questionnaires to be distributed to the congregation. A target release date of October 1st is planned for the first questionnaires to be distributed.

Continuing Business:

- A. Pastors' picture walls update. Carmen will purchase some new frames and reframe some photos where necessary.
- B. Re-key church doors. Peter continues to wait on a written proposal and bid from the locksmith. Action tabled until October meeting.
